19. Heaviest Marrow with stalk

6. Exhibitors will bring their own material for staging their exhibits – plates, trays, vases etc
7. All quantities and sizes in the schedule are to be strictly adhered to
8. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry
9. Judging will commence at 11.00 a.m. prompt (closed doors)
The judges' decision is final
10. No exhibits to be removed until after 4 00 p.m.
11. All entry forms and money are to be delivered to one of the following
by 10.00 p.m. on THURSDAY 22nd August 2013
