Parish Council Meeting held on 10th March 2014

Highways: Neither Northamptonshire Highways nor the Police determined that there was any compelling evidence to support a 30 mph zone as far as the Cemetery and therefore the 30 mph limit will simply be extended by 23 metres. It is also proposed to install a village name plate near the new speed terminals and to apply a 'Pedestrian In Road' warning sign near to the Cemetery entrance.

The Parish Council has put in a request to Northamptonshire Highways for signage in the village to be cleaned.

Year End: The Council updated its Asset Register for YE 31st March 2014 and set out its objectives for 2014-2015 in its Action Plan, which no longer include those of carriageway resurfacing of the B4031 and Wheelers Rise. The Council will be reviewing its Quality Status, which it gained for 4 years in January 2011, and whether to seek re-accreditation.
